Opening 1 of a Suit

The Opener's 1st Bid

- 1♣ 12-19 HCP 4+ clubs
- 1♥ 12-19 HCP 4+ hearts
- 1♥ 12-19 HCP 4+ spades

1NT 12-14 Balanced Hand (previous lesson)

Important: If you CAN open 1NT on your hand, you MUST open 1NT, NOT 1-of-a-suit.

When opening 1 of a suit, it is important to bid your suits in the correct order so you can describe your hand accurately to your partner. Use the following rules:

Basic Opening Bid Rules

The order in which you bid your suits is very important. Here are the rules:

- Bid your longest suit or with equal-length suits:
- Bid the lower ranking of two 4-card suits ("bottoms up") or
- Bid the higher ranking of two 5-card suits ("tops down").

When to respond to 1-of-a-suit Opening

- 0-5 HCP pass as the partnership has less than 25 HCP, game is unlikely.
- 6+ HCP respond to the opening, partner may have 19 HCP so there's a chance of game.

Responding Priorities

1st Priority: If your partner opened a Major suit (1 ♥ or 1♠) and you have 4+ card support and 6+ points, you should confirm playing in the Major suit fit and raise, as follows:


- 0-5 points pass
- 10-12 points raise 1 v to 3 v or 1 to 3 h
- 13+ points you have enough to make game so raise 1♥ to 4♥ or 1♠ to 4♠.

What if you don't have support for your partner's suit?

If you don't have 4+ support for partner's suit, or your partner opened a minor suit (1♣ or 1♦), but you have 6+ HCP, you should normally respond in a new suit, or 1NT. This is covered in the next week's topic.

Opener's rebid after Responder raises

When Responder has raised Opener's Major suit, then Opener uses the info Responder has given and applies arithmetic to determine the level of the final contract. For example, if they opened 1♥ on a strong hand of 19 points, once Responder raises, even just to 2♥, they know their side has at least 19+6 = 25 points, enough for game – and they should bid 4♥.


