The Auction

Every suit has a ranking order



Each bid must be higher than the previous bid

1+	1 ♦	1 🗸	1 🔺	1NT
2 ♣	2 ♦	2 💙	2 🔺	2NT
3 ♣	3 ♦	3 🗸	3 🔺	3NT
4♣	4 🔶	4♥	4 🛧	4NT

etc


- The first person to bid is the Opener
- Opener's partner is the Responder

Opener's First Bid


	Points	Description
14	12 - 19	4 + clubs
1 🔶	12 – 19	4 + diamonds
1 🗸	12 – 19	4 + hearts
14	12 – 19	4 + spades
1NT	12 – 14	Balanced hand SPECIAL CASE – LAST WEEK

Basic Rules for Opening 1-suit

• You must have enough High Card Points

Rules for 1-level suit openings

• Bid your longest suit first



Basic Rules for 1-level suit openings

•Bid your lower ranking 4-card suit first





What do you open?

•Bid your higher ranking **5-card** suit first

Open 1 ... open your lower ranking 4-card suit first

... open your higher ranking 5-card suit first



Summary for 1-level suit openers

- •Open with 12-19 points
- •Bid your longest suit first
- If you have two 4-card suits bid the lower ranked suit first

12-19

- If you have two 5-card suits bid the higher ranked suit first
- Suit quality does not matter

• You must have enough High Card Points

Basic Rules for Responder's bids

- **1. Support** partner's suit *this lesson*
- 2. Bid a new suit (*done in later lessons*)
- 3. Bid No Trumps (done in later lessons)

You have 3 choices

Responder's Limit bids

• Support partner's suit if possible

These are limit bids ... they are NOT FORCING

FIRST CHOICE: Support Partner's suit

- Minimum (6-9) ... bid at the 2-level
- •Nearly game (10-12) ... bid at the 3-level
- •Game (13+) ... bid at the Game level

These are limit bids ... they are NOT FORCING

Partner Opens 1♥ ... what do you bid



6 - 9 points ... with a fit

Bid 2 V ... MINIMUM

Partner Opens 1 ... what do you bid



10 – 12 points ... with a fit

Bid 3 V ... CLOSE TO GAME

Partner Opens 1♥ ... what do you bid



13+ points ... with a fit

Bid 4 V ... GAME

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Opener's REBID after 2-level (6-9) raise

OPENER	HCP	ACTION
Minimum	12 — 15	PASS
Close to Game	16 – 17	INVITE (bid 3)
GAME	18 – 19	BID GAME

Opener's REBID after 3-level raise

OPENER	HCP	ACTION	
Minimum	12 – 13	PASS	
GAME	14+	BID GAME





Lesson 4 Summary

- Open 1 of a suit with 12-19 points and an unbalanced hand
- Open by bidding *longest suit first*
- With two 4-card suits, open *lower ranking*
- With two 5-card suits, open *higher ranking*
- With a fit (4+ cards) in Opener's suit, Responder raises to 2 of the suit with 6-9 points, to 3 of the suit with 10-12 points, and to game with 13+ points
- Opener rebids according to the total number high card points known to be held in the two hands. With fewer than 25, passes; with 25 or more, bids game; or invites to game asking if Responder is maximum.

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
