Responder's New Suit Bids



Basic Rules for Responder's bids

- 1. Support Opener's Major suit (covered last week)
- 2. Bid a new suit
- 3. Bid 1NT if options 1 or 2 are not possible (when you have 6-9 HCP and can't raise or bid a suit at the 1-level)

You have 3 choices



New Suit Bids by Responder

- 1-level bid = 6+ HCP
- 2-level bid = 10+ HCP

(NB - don't jump to 2-level if you can bid at 1-level)

These bids are unlimited

they are FORCING

Opener MUST bid again



Which Suit do you bid first?

- Longest suit
- 2. Lower available 4-card suit
- 3. Higher ranking 5-card suit

These bids are unlimited

they are FORCING

Opener MUST bid again



1NT Bid by Responder

- With 6-9 HCP often 1NT is the only response available
- A 1NT response DOES NOT promise a balanced hand.

The 1NT Response is often a bid of "last resort" when you have 6-9 HCP It is NOT FORCING



Partner Opens I ♥ What do you bid with this hand?



6+ points and no fit in hearts

Bid 1
your own suit at the 1-level



Partner Opens I V What do you bid with this hand?



10+ points and no fit in hearts

Bid 2

your own suit at the 2-level



Partner Opens I V What do you bid with this hand?



6+ points and no fit in hearts.

Not enough points to bid your longer suit at the 2-level

Bid 1

your own suit at the 1-level

Partner Opens I V What do you bid with this hand?



6+ points and no fit in hearts.

You cannot bid your own suit at the 1-level or 2-level

You MUST Bid 1NT

the only bid left available to you



Basic Rules for Opener's Rebid – after a Suit Response:

- Agree partner's suit if you have a fit:
- AT THE SAME TIME:
- Describe the quality of your hand MINIMUM, NEARLY GAME or GAME

Covered later:

- Bid another suit (if you can)
- Bid your own suit again (with extra length)

18-19	GAME	
16 - 17	Nearly Game	
12 - 15	Minimum	



Supporting Responder's Suit

- MINIMUM (12-15) ... raise a level
- INVITATIONAL (16-17) ... jump a level
- **GAME** (18-19) ... bid game

MUST HAVE A FIT ie, 4+ support



The Bridge House Different levels of Opening and Responding Hands

OPENER

RESPONDER

PENTHOUSE -GAME


18 - 19 pts

MIDDLE FLOOR -NEARLY GAME

16 - 17 pts

GROUND FLOOR -MINIMUM

12 - 15 pts



13 + pts

10 - 12 pts

6 - 9 pts

0 - 11 pts share with the dog (and fleas)



0 – 5 pts share with the dog

Opener's REBID with a Balanced Hand after INT response (6-9)

OPENER	НСР	ACTION
Minimum	12 – 15	Pass
Close to Game	16 – 17	Bid 2NT
GAME	18 – 19	BID GAME Bid 3NT



Opener's Rebid – SUPPORT PARTNER

You open I ♥ with this hand



Partner bids 1♠

You have a fit (14 HCP)

MINIMUM HAND - Bid 2 4



Opener's Rebid – SUPPORT PARTNER

You open I ♦ with this hand



Partner bids 1 \(\nsigma\)

You have a fit, 16 HCP

NEARLY GAME (INVITATIONAL) – Bid 3 💙



Opener's Rebid – SUPPORT PARTNER

You open I & with this hand



Partner bids 1♠

You have a fit, 19 HCP

GAME - Bid 4
