# **Balanced Opener's rebids**

We learnt last week that when responder bids **a new suit**, it is **forcing**. A new suit response is an **unlimited** bid and can have a wide range of HCP from 6 up to the maximum possible.

As Opener is forced to rebid when partner responds in a new suit, you will learn it is good strategy to think of your rebid options before making your opening bid.

Remember that a **Major suit fit is a priority** – if you find one, agree the suit immediately. Do not rebid NT if you have a Major suit fit! Reaching the best Major suit fit is more important than who plays the hand.

For example, when you have a balanced hand, you can plan ahead using the following table:

### Opener's bidding strategy with balanced hands:

- 12-14 HCP BAL: Open 1NT. **DO NOT open 1 suit** you often won't have any valid rebid.
- 15-17 HCP BAL: Open 1-suit, plan to rebid a non-jump NT, unless a Major suit fit is found
- 18-19 HCP BAL: Open 1-suit, plan to rebid a jump in NT unless there's a Major suit fit.
- 20-22 HCP BAL: Open 2NT lucky you to have this much! More on this later.

## Stronger (15-19 HCP) balanced hands with a 5-card suit (including Majors)

When you have a balanced hand with 15-19 HCP, this is too strong to open 1NT, so according to the above table you open 1 of a suit. Your general plan to make a rebid in NT, unless a Major suit fit shows up.

Note that, as well as the 15-19 HCP 4333 and 4432 shapes, this strategy also includes **all** balanced hands of 5332 shape, including those with a 5-card Major suit.


In other words, while you shouldn't open 1NT with a 5-card Major, it is best to **rebid NT** to show your stronger range when you have 15-19 HCPs **with** *any* **5332-shaped hand.** 

## Responder's rebids after Opener rebids NT

When opener rebids NT, they will be showing a *stronger* balanced hand – either 15-17 HCP, if they didn't jump, or 18-19 HCP, if their rebid was a jump in NT.

After an auction where Opener rebids 1NT, showing 15-17 HCP and a balanced hand, Responding is similar to responding to a 1NT opening, noting the increased HCP range.

As **Opener's NT rebid is a limit bid**, **Responder can now take charge** of the auction, they become "the BOSS", either to decide the final contract – or to ask further questions – in a similar way as responding to a 1NT opening.

- (a) A balanced hand with 10+ HCP  $\rightarrow$  raise to 3NT. (The arithmetic is 10 + 15 or more from partner = 25+ HCP and enough for game).
- (b) 10+ points and a 6+ card ♥ or ♠ suit → bid 4♥ or ♠4 game, knowing that there are at least 25 points and at least an 8-card suit fit in the Major.
- (c) Less than 8 HCP & an unbalanced 5+ card  $\spadesuit$  suit  $\rightarrow$  sign off in 2 $\spadesuit$ .
- (d) 8-9 HCP and a balanced hand  $\rightarrow$  invite to 3NT by bidding 2NT.
- (e) 10+ points and a 5 card Major → bid your Major at the 3-level asking Opener to bid game in the Major with 3-card support or bid 3NT with only 2-card support.

Remember, just like when responding to 1NT, if there is a NT rebid, Responder is the BOSS! Their goal is to reach the best contract – this is more important than which side becomes declarer.
